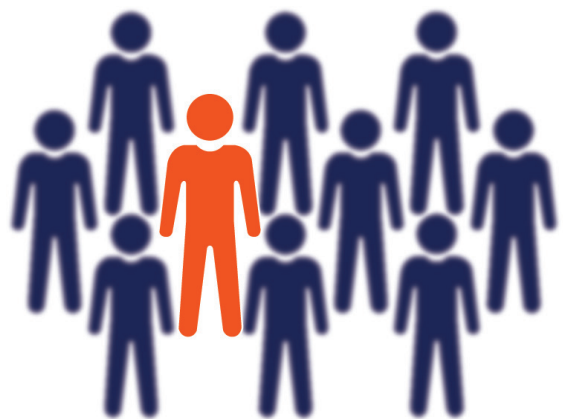

How is the PrismRA test performed?

The PrismRA test is a routine blood draw. Your blood sample is sent to Scipher Medicine's specialized laboratory for analysis, and your provider will get the results within two weeks.

The PrismRA test is a laboratory test that tells you if TNF inhibitor therapies are less likely to work for you.¹ Once you know, you can avoid them and instead try something else.
